Job Duties: Research (40%): Establish and maintain an active and productive program of research within area of specialization. Teaching/Advising (40%): Teach two courses per semester including introductory through MA-level courses in Ancient Greek and courses in ancient literature and culture in translation. Teaching duties include developing syllabi; preparing and teaching lectures; creating, administering, and grading homework assignments and exams; holding regular office hours; and supervising Graduate Teaching Assistants when appropriate.
